





Lotus Notes 8 – Basics

- § Represents a significant investment in a growing business
- § Subscription upgrade
- § Open beta scheduled for Q1 of 2007 generally available mid-year
- § Microsoft Windows (XP and Vista), Linux (SLED and RHEL), and Mac
- § Seamless Interoperability works with your existing Lotus Notes applications
- § Much of added value only needs Lotus Domino Server
- § Basis for future innovations

What is Eclipse?

- § Open source Java™ based platform
- § Contributors include IBM
- § Platform for end-user and developer products

What's the benefit?

- § Powerful contribution model
- § Large (and growing) developer community
- § Cross platform (Microsoft Windows, Linux, & MAC)

Lotus Notes 8 – Using the IBM Lotus Expeditor Platform

What is Lotus Expeditor?

- § IBM common platform based on Eclipse
- § Available embedded and as standalone product

What's the benefit?

- § Same extensions work across many IBM products (Lotus Notes, Lotus Sametime, etc.)
- § Server managed
- § Powerful services available to applications (e.g., offline)

So what does this technology really mean?

- § For an end-user, nothing
 - **4** Except of course improved user experience, productivity, etc.
- § For a developer, increased flexibility and possibilities
 - 4 Can continue doing what you're doing (LotusScript, @Formula, Forms, Views, etc.)
 - 4 Can leverage new mechanisms (Eclipse plug-ins, Composite Applications, etc.)
- § For an administrator, increased flexibility and possibilities
 - 4 Can continue managing and deploying clients the way you do today (Smart Upgrade, SMS, etc.)
 - **4** Can take advantage of Lotus Expeditor client management features to help improve TCO

- 4 Templates, Extension manager, etc.
- § Add new search target to search center
- § Add new application to sidebar
- § Add new action when click right on someone's name
- § Add new menu items
- § Branding



Mashups for Business


- § Build and deploy next-generation composite applications


